Estimate of Costs Bachelor's Study 2021-2024

Non-EU/non-EFTA nationalities





A bachelor's study programme at Wageningen University will take at least 3 academic years.

Non-EU/non-EFTA students should take into account that three years of bachelor's study will cost approximately

€84,187.10. The estimate of costs presented below is based on three years of study for a student who must pay the institutional tuition fee 3 for non-EU/non-EFTA¹ nationals.

Institutional tuition fees 3 for non-EU/non-EFTA1 nationals

Students who do not meet the nationality requirement pay the Wageningen University institutional tuition fee 3. Please see the factsheet 'Online Master's students (part-time) - Tuition fees 2021-2022' for more information on the nationality requirement.

The institutional tuition fee 3 is determined by the Executive Board of Wageningen University each year:

Academic year 2021-2022: bachelor's institutional tuition fee 3 = €15,700.00

Academic year 2022-2023: bachelor's institutional tuition fee 3 = €15,800.00 (estimate)

Academic year 2023-2024: bachelor's institutional tuition fee 3 = €15,900.00 (estimate)

The institutional tuition fees for the academic years 2022-2023 and 2023-2024 are not yet known and will be determined in May 2021 and May 2022 respectively.

Living expenses: The minimum amount you will require for living expenses is approximately €925.00 a month. This includes housing (approx. €400.00 a month), food, books and study materials. Students who arrive in Wageningen mid-August will require an extra half month, €450.00, for living expenses. Wageningen University is obliged to prove to the Immigration Authorities that students have adequate financial resources. For that reason all students who require a residence permit need to transfer the living allowance to the bank account of Wageningen University. Wageningen University will administer the funds during their study and refund the living allowance on monthly basis.

Insurance: Another expense to be taken into account is insurance for health and legal liability. All students are obliged to have a student insurance, which includes a health insurance.

Residence permit: Wageningen University applies for the entrance visa and residence permit for every new non-EU student who is going to start a study at Wageningen University. The total cost for the entrance visa and residence permit have to be paid by the student before Wageningen University will start applying for the visa and permit.

Handling Fees: Additional administration and support costs for the Student Service Center team over the period of your study and stay, from your application until your graduation.

Estimated total costs for 3 years:

This does not include travel costs to and from the Netherlands.

The mentioned amounts apply to students starting in September 2021 and may be subject to change.

Payment

Wageningen University will send students who pay the institutional tuition fee an invoice. The total amount for the 1st year, estimated at €31570, has to be paid into our bank account before the deadline mentioned on the invoice. Wageningen University will start the entry visa procedure upon receipt of the total amount for the 1st year of study. The amount for the second year will have to be paid before July 1, 2022 and for the third year before July 1, 2023. In the amounts to be paid, living expenses are included. Each month, the University will refund 925 euros of this amount into the student's bank account.

Payment in a currency other than euro's should be equivalent to the above amounts (differences in exchange rates are not acceptable).

Note: Non-EU students who will open a Dutch bank account upon arrival, are strongly advised to bring a credit card (Visa or Mastercard) or cash for the first month. Since it will take a few weeks before you receive the living allowance from the University on your Dutch bank account. You will need the credit card or cash to pay for rent, groceries, transportation, a bike and sometimes furniture, books or a phone card. You are advised to bring at least 300 euros in cash, but preferably between 500 to 1000 euros.
