You'll need to have:


- A certified copy of your academic transcript

Entrance Requirements

To be eligible for the Exchange Programme, you should have:

- Completed at least one year of study at university
- A cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 2.75 or greater (on a scale of 4.0) or a B average or higher.

Admission and Enrolment

- An admission letter/Offer of Place
- Enrolment and course information.

(There are restrictions on enrolment to landscape courses due to limited studio spaces.)

Course Load and Credit System

As a Study Abroad or Exchange student you may choose from any of the courses we offer, as long as you have the appropriate preparation, and you must study full-time.

Undergraduate students

Almost all undergraduate courses are 15 credits each, and most students will enrol in 60 credits per semester (4 courses). The minimum number of credits you may study in a semester is 45 (3 courses).

You can choose from courses at the 100 level (1st year), 200 level (2nd year), or 300 level (3rd year). Check the prerequisites for each course at the 200 and 300 levels to ensure you have suitable preparation.

Postgraduate students

Postgraduate courses are at the 600 level and are 20 credits. Students enrol in 3 courses per semester.

60 credits at Lincoln University is equivalent to 30 ECTS or 16 US Credits.

Courses and Timetable

At the start of each semester you will have access to course outlines. The Study Abroad and Exchange Coordinator can provide you with copies earlier on request. These may not be the final versions but would be suitable for a pre-approval process at your home university.

On arrival you'll have an opportunity to discuss your course selections with Lincoln's academic staff and you'll still be able to make changes during the first week of the semester.

Visa

International students must hold a current and valid student visa/permit. You will need to apply for your student visa before you arrive.

Insurance

The New Zealand Ministry of Education (NZMOE) requires all international students to have "appropriate and current medical and travel insurance for the duration of their planned period of study". This is compulsory.

All Lincoln University international students are automatically insured with Studentsafe University.

You do not need to apply or fill out an application form. Please note if you have a pre-existing condition, you need to complete an assessment form for additional cover.

If you have an insurance policy that meets the requirements to satisfy the New Zealand Ministry of Education, complete the Insurance Policy Assessment Application Form.
