

Building Coherence to Improve our Food System

- **Policy** Integrating health, social, environmental and economic objectives in our approaches to food-related policies.
- Programs Delivering streamlined and complementary programs that focus
 on the user experience and pursue shared outcomes.
- Communication Coordinated engagement with partners, stakeholders and all people living in Canada.
- **Connections** A **Canadian Food Policy Advisory Council** to bring together stakeholders and experts to facilitate collaborative action.

Four near-term action areas - \$134.4 million, over 5 years

- Make Canadian Food the Top Choice at Home and Abroad
- Support Food Security in Northern and Indigenous Communities
- Reduce Food Waste
