Application procedure	<p>After students are officially nominated by home institution, they will receive an info email concerning the application procedure.</p> <p>The entire application procedure is carried out via our online portal Mobility-Online, all procedures are described for the students in the course.</p>

Study Courses open to exchange students	<p>Generally all courses are open to exchange students.</p> <p>Course attendance in the Faculty of Architecture and Landscape Planning is limited.</p> <p>Additionally, exchange students have limited access to courses of the Double Degree/Master Program "Innovation Management, Entrepreneurship and Sustainability" (IMES).</p>
Course Catalogue and Course Language	<p>Most of the courses (90%) are taught in German. However, we also offer a growing number of courses held in English. The course selection varies from semester to semester.</p> <p>Online course catalogue (in German): www.tu-berlin.de/lsf/</p> <p>English courses: www.tu-berlin.de/?137266</p> <p>The final course list for the semester is usually online in late February/March (for summer semester) and August/September (for winter semester).</p>

Explanation grading system	<p>1,0 - 1,5 - ECTS grade A (excellent) 1,6 - 2,0 - ECTS grade B (good) 2,1 - 3,0 - ECTS grade C (good/satisfactory) 3,1 - 3,5 - ECTS grade D (satisfactory) 3,6 - 4,0 - ECTS grade E (sufficient) 4,1 - 5,0 - ECTS grade F (failed)</p>
ECTS available	Yes, though sometimes converted from SWS (Semester Weekly hours) or LP (credit points).
Language requirements	<u>Proficiency in German on at least A2.2 level of CEFR within the application deadline - a certificate of B1 level or higher must be provided before the semester starts.</u>
Language certificate required	We require from all applicants who will attend courses an official language certificate for German or English (only for thesis, special programs, study fields offered in English).
Preparatory language courses for incoming students	<p>Pre-semester German intensive language courses at ZEMS (Zentraleinrichtung Moderne Sprachen) - from level B1 and higher - <u>admission through a test.</u></p> <p>The course fee is 275 Euro for a four weeks course - 80 hours.</p> <p>Winter semester 2021/22: 6th of September - 1st of October, 2021 Summer semester 2022: 7th of March - 1st of April, 2022</p> <p>ZEMS-Website: www.zems.tu-berlin.de</p>

Housing assistance	The International Office can only offer a very small number of StudierendenWERK dormitory rooms. Detailed application information will be provided after the acceptance.
Living Expenses estimated per month	<p>Housing: Between €250-500</p> <p>Food/Drink: approx. €200 Euros</p> <p>Books: €30 (depending on the field of study)</p> <p>Public transportation: approx. €260 (“Semesterticket”) payable once for the entire semester</p> <p>Please note that these figures can merely represent a rough estimate. A lot depends on the students’ personal lifestyle.</p>
Health insurance/other insurances	<p><u>Health Insurance</u></p> <p>Students with a valid European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) do not need an extra insurance. Those without will need to either be registered with a German health insurance company or need to check if their own private insurance is sufficient for a waiver of the statutory health insurance requirement upon arrival in Berlin.</p> <p><u>Third Party Liability Insurance</u></p> <p>It is the students’ responsibility to acquire an insurance (from home) for personal belongings, accidents and third party liability while studying in Germany. TU Berlin cannot not cover any losses that may occur.</p>
Additional fees to pay	If staying in a dormitory, students are required to pay a deposit of one and half months’ rent.
Student jobs available/allowed	It is difficult to find a student job in Berlin, so international students should not base their finances on a student job.
VISA	<p>If necessary the sending and receiving institutions will provide assistance in securing visas for incoming and outbound mobile participants, according to the requirements of the ERASMUS Charter for Higher Education</p> <p>www.betreuung-int-stud.tu-berlin.de</p>
