



Biodiversity Challenge – Join the Bioblitz

How does it work?

Counting species on WUR's campus and external WUR locations is easy. During the period of 22 May to 1 July, we host a 'Bioblitz' on waarneming.nl, where observations can be entered by anyone. Every observation that is entered from within the boundaries of the campus or other WUR locations (indicated below) will automatically count towards the end result.

Step 1: Log in or create an account

If you want to submit your observation through the website, in iObs or Obsmapp, you will need a waarneming.nl or observation.org account. Sign up: <https://waarneming.nl/accounts/signup/>

Step 2: Add your observation

You may be an experienced observer, or have little experience with counting species. Fear not: everyone can join! It's easy and it's fun.

a) Identifying and submitting through mobile apps

There are three mobile apps that you can use to enter observations. These are **ObsIdentify** (all platforms), **ObsMapp** (for Android) and **iObs** (for Apple). You can find more information on and downloads of these apps on <https://waarneming.nl/apps/> or in the Apple Store/Play Store.


The benefit of using an app is that you can enter observations right away in the field. Are you unsure about what it is that you see? Both ObsIdentify and ObsMapp allow you to take a picture, after which the app will tell you what species it is. Then you can upload it to waarneming.nl directly. Your observation will be checked by an admin of waarneming.nl to verify it is the correct species.

The apps automatically save the coordinates of your observations, so there is no need to select your position on a map. Other details such as age, stadium or behaviour can be added along with sound recordings and photos, if you like.

ObsMapp and iObs require an account on waarneming.nl or observation.org (see Step 1). For ObsIdentify, no account is needed; however, it is recommended to have one so you can save, review and share your observations.

b) On Waarneming.nl

Go to waarneming.nl and log in to your account. Click 'Add' in the top left corner and then click 'Observation'.



Now, you will see a screen in which you can enter the time and location of the observation, which species, how many and you can add photos. Click 'Save' to add the observation to the Bioblitz.
