To find a course, students should use the filter "FACULTY" and choose Faculty of Science. A full course list for the upcoming semester is published at the time the application period opens.	
<b>Entry requirements</b>	Students should have studied at least 2 semesters at their home university before applying. Specific requirements for each course have to be met before admission. These can be found in each course description on the course search site for exchange students.	
<b>Subject areas</b>	Students are expected to choose a majority of their courses and credits in the subject area, which is covered by the inter-institutional agreement. Upon request, it might be possible to take 1-2 courses within other Departments at the Faculty of Science. It is not possible to take courses from other Faculties at the University of Gothenburg.

<b>Nomination deadline</b>	<p>We are happy to accept nominations as early as January (for the autumn semester) and August (for the spring semester).</p> <p>The general deadline for nominations is the <b>1<sup>st</sup> of April</b> for the autumn semester and <b>1<sup>st</sup> of October</b> for the spring semester. Please note that you might have agreed on other deadlines in your agreement.</p> <p><b><i>Please note that a nomination is only considered accepted if you receive a confirmation e-mail from the international coordinator at the University of Gothenburg.</i></b></p>
