

## A. Exemptions English language proficiency

---

1. Applicants who have or will complete their **full** Bachelor/Master degree in one of the below mentioned countries are exempted from submitting an English proficiency.

The conditions are:

- The programme was completely conducted in the English language.
- The programme was not part of a double degree programme where part of the programme was conducted in a different country
- The programme must have been a on campus programme.

The exemption countries are:

- Australia
- Canada (except universities in Quebec)
- Canada (bachelor degree students from McGill University with English as the language of instruction)
- Ireland
- New Zealand
- Singapore
- South Africa
- The United Kingdom
- The United States of America

There is no need to upload any documents under the subject 'English requirement' as you should be able to submit without uploading anything. If not please upload a dummy file.

2. Applicants who have completed their Bachelors/Masters at a Dutch University (WO) are exempted from submitting an English Proficiency test. There is no need to upload any documents under the subject 'English requirement' as you should be able to submit without uploading anything. If not please upload a dummy file.
3. Applicants who have completed a Bachelors programme at a Dutch university of applied sciences (HBO) conducted completely in the English language are exempted from submitting an English Proficiency test. They are required to upload a signed statement from their institution that the medium of instruction during the complete Bachelor's programme they followed was English. A diploma supplement stating this information is also sufficient.
4. Students who have completed a Minor at Wageningen University with a minimum of 24 ECTS in WUR-courses. Please upload your transcript of records of all obtained courses at Wageningen University in the portal.
