The grading table requires universities to keep track of their grading practice and culture, which is good practice in many institutions across Europe. The ECTS grading table allows for simple, transparent interpretation and conversion of grades from one system or context to another, and therefore does justice to the level of academic performance of all learners. This provides all necessary information to convert the grade in any local grading system.
