A master programme at Wageningen University will take at least 2 academic years.

EU students should take into account that a master study at Wageningen University will cost approximately €28,000.00.

Tuition fees: The statutory fees are determined by the Dutch government and based on two full academic years (24 months). The tuition fee for the academic year 2019/2020 still has to be determined. If you meet the nationality and degree requirement, you are eligible to pay the statutory fee. Please see the factsheet 'tuition fee 2018/2019 – which tuition fee do I have to pay' for further information on tuition fees.

Academic year 2018/2019 : tuition fee €2060.00

Academic year 2019/2020 : tuition fee €2110.00 (estimate)

Living expenses: The minimum amount you will require for living expenses is approximately €890.00 a month. This includes housing (approx. €400.00 a month), food, books and study materials. Students who arrive in Wageningen mid-August will require an extra half month, €445.00, for living expenses.

Insurance: Another expense to consider is insurance for health and legal liability. Students with a [European Health Insurance Card](#) are only required to arrange legal liability insurance - this can be arranged by Wageningen University.

Estimated total costs for 2 years:

Tuition fee	: €4,170.00
Living expenses	: €21,360.00
Health insurance	: €1,416.00
Books	: €1,000.00

The estimated total costs for students with a EU or EFTA nationality are €27,946.00. This does not include travel costs to and from the Netherlands.

Tuition fee is paid per academic year. The statutory tuition fee of academic year 2019/2020 will be determined by the Dutch government at the end of 2018.

All the above-mentioned amounts apply to students starting in September 2018 and may be subject to change.

Payment in a currency other than euro's should be equivalent to the above-mentioned amounts (differences in exchange rates are not acceptable).
