Profile

Founded in 1665 by Christian Albrecht, former Duke of Holstein-Gottorp, Kiel University is the largest and most renowned academic institution in the capital of Schleswig-Holstein, Germany's northernmost state. Today the University has some 25,000 students.

Kiel's proximity to the sea is a big attraction for many young people and makes it an ideal place for international students to spend their time abroad. Strolling along the promenade, one can watch the big container ships and cruisers passing by and soak up the maritime atmosphere. All along the fjord, picturesque beaches – some of them only 5 kilometres away from Kiel University's campus – provide ideal conditions for water sports and recreational activities.



The Faculty of Business, Economics, and Social Science

At the time of writing (winter term 2014/2015) around 4,000 students are enrolled in the Faculty of Business, Economics, and Social Sciences, more than half of them studying either Economics or Business Administration. In conjunction with various other institutions, notably the renowned Kiel Institute of World Economy (IfW), the Faculty offers a wide variety of courses designed to ensure ideal preparation for future professional life. The broad array of courses available guarantees high-quality education in economics and business administration and provides first-hand experience of research work on business and economics. In addition, the German National Library of Economics (ZBW), the world's largest specialist library of its kind, is an unparalleled source of economics and business literature and the specific information required for detailed, in-depth economic research.

Bachelor of Science Programs: Economics and Business Administration

Both Bachelor degrees (Economics and Business Administration) call for a standard study period of six semesters comprising 180 ECTS. They are designed to provide students with the basic theoretical and empirical knowledge they will need in their later lives, as well as a general understanding of economic phenomena and relations.

Accommodation

There are several public institutions providing affordable housing for students, ranging from bed-sitters and rooms in shared apartments to studio accommodation. Unfortunately, demand is high, so it is not possible to provide a room for every student in this way. Alternative options are privately owned student housing and the free housing market. Especially for students planning to stay in Kiel for an extended period, moving into an apartment of one's own may be a very sensible choice.

At the International Center, students can apply directly for admission to student housing. The rental period for student dormitories/halls of residence is usually six months.
