

Annet Pauwelussen

Annet obtained a Ma degree in anthropology from Leiden University and a MSc. degree in International Development (MID) from Wageningen University. Since 2011 Annet is working on her PhD research with the chair group Sociology of Development and Change. For this research she explores maritime networks of fishing, family and trade in marine regions in East-Kalimantan and South-Sulawesi (Indonesia) and examines how they relate to, or interfere with, marine conservation initiatives in the region. She conducted 18 months of ethnographic research, travelling with traders, seafarers and conservation practitioners to describe how these mobile sea-based networks are enacted in practice and movement.

In Indonesia Annet has fieldwork experience in East-Kalimantan, South Sulawesi and Yogyakarta.
