Copyright

As soon as you start writing a paper, you have to do with copyright issues. Copyright is the exclusive right of the maker of a work to publish it or to duplicate it, also called exploitation right. In the Netherlands, copyright also involves *personality or moral rights*.

Transfer of copyright versus Licence to Publish

Initially you and your co-workers own the copyright of the paper, but in most cases the exploitation right is passed on to the publisher by signing a Copyright Transfer Agreement.

Instead of transferring rights you can grant a publisher a *licence* to publish or duplicate your paper. In this case you retain the copyright of the paper. A Licence to Publish can be downloaded from the website 'Copyright Toolbox'.

Another way to keep the copyright of your paper is to publish in an *Open Access (OA) journal*. OA journals work with a Creative Commons Attribution License (CC-BY) which allows anyone to download, reuse, reprint, modify, distribute, and/or copy your paper, so long as the original authors and source are cited. No permission is required from the authors or the publishers.

Why worry about copyright?


Transferring the copyright to a publisher might lead to a restriction in reusing your own paper for other purposes. You can think of:

- Publishing the paper on your personal website or that of your research group

- Publishing the paper via the institutional repository
- Using the paper in teaching materials

Open Access policy

Wageningen UR supports OA by stimulating authors to deposit the final author version (postprint) of their publications in the institutional repository WaY (Wageningen Yield). To find out if a publisher allows self-archiving you can check the copy of the agreement you signed when you published your paper, or you can consult the SHERPA/RoMEO website (www.sherpa.ac.uk/romeo/). If self-archiving is allowed, a postprint of your paper can be sent to way.library@wur.nl.
