

Privacy Statement Student Food Systems Innovation Challenge

In the Student Food Systems Innovation Challenge 20 student teams from Universities all over the world (Brazil, South Africa, The United States, The Netherlands, India, Czech Republic, Uganda, Belgium and China), compete by presenting innovative practical and outstanding ideas on Food System Transformation.

The Final ideas of the teams will be presented on 23rd of November in four different sessions, in the form of video pitches. A panel of experts from A5 universities has assessed these videos and will announce which innovative idea and team wins the challenge. This will be announced in the plenary closing session webinar of the challenge the 24th of November from 10:30-12:00

What we do with your personal data

Student Food Systems Innovation Challenge has a website, which is hosted as part of the WUR website. Therefore the [general privacy statement](#) for the website, including a specific [cookie Statement](#), for the website applies.

Besides Student Food Systems Innovation Challenge uses WebinarJam and Zoom to support the broadcast of our event and recording of this broadcast. By using these services the collecting of data is needed in an effort to provide these services to our participants and the audience of the finale of this challenge. However, we strictly minimize the use of personal data to an absolute minimum.

- Streaming services; (required) IP address, name and emailaddress.

The streaming services, Zoom and WebinarJam, do not use cookies.

The recording of these sessions will be uploaded to Youtube, to provide a possibility to (re)watch the event. Besides recordings might be used for promotional activities for future events. More about this can be read in the terms & conditions of this event.

Do we share personal data?

As a general principle, Student Food Systems Innovation Challenge, does not disclose your personal data to third parties.

An important exception is the sharing of personal data when it is required under applicable law or in course of any legal proceedings. In that case, the Student Food Systems Innovation Challenge must share data with authoritative bodies, for example with law enforcement. This will occur, however, under supervision of a privacy officer.

How long we retain your data

Student Food Systems Innovation Challenge does not store data any longer than needed for its purpose. All data within Zoom and WebinarJam will be deleted after the event with the exception of the recording of this event.

How do we protect your personal data?

Obviously, the processing of personal data includes appropriate security measures. Therefore, this Website/App is secured and we also demand that of our partners. Student Food Systems Innovation Challenge uses services provided by WUR. The starting point for WUR to secure data is NEN-EN-ISO/IEC 27002:2017. This certification ensures personal data is protected securely. Additionally, WUR also monitors whether there are unlawful traffic or activities on the website.

As Student Food Systems Innovation Challenge uses WebinarJam and Zoom, there are extra measures to ensure the data is being stored securely. E.g. Zoom will transport its data through data centers within the EU for all EU participants and audience, there will be a lobby before entering the sessions and no more data will be stored than strictly necessary.
