## Application form clothing subsidies

Ssa's can submit an application for clothing subsidy if the WUR logo is fully printed on the clothing. In principle, this subsidy can only be requested for competition clothing. Competition clothing is defined as clothes that one person wears during a competition. If members of an ssa do not participate in a competition, the association can request subsidy for sports related association clothing.
Ssa's that apply for such a subsidy for clothes have a duty to print the WUR logo on the relevant clothing. Such printing is subject to the condition that the WUR logo is clearly visible and must be as or more visible than any other sponsor or logo.

The value of the maximum subsidy depends on the size of the relevant ssa and applies for 3 years. The subsidy amounts to $€ 400$,- in the case of an ssa with fewer than 40 members, $€ 600$,- in the case of an ssa with 40 to 70 members, $€ 800$,- in the case of an ssa with 71 to 100 members and $€ 1000$,- in the case of a ssa with more than 100 members. An ssa itself is responsible for spreading the amount that is to be spent over three years.
Should the membership of an ssa vary within this period of three years and the club consequently fall within a different subsidy category, an application may be submitted for the largest maximum subsidy. An ssa receives a subsidy equivalent to $50 \%$ of the purchase price payable for each piece of clothing subject to a maximum of $€ 20$,- each (the purchase price includes printing costs).

The form will only be taken into consideration if it is filled in completely.
